This project returns an abandoned commercial space into a center for community activity.

The blighted property, a former grocery store, was an eyesore on the major thoroughfare in a struggling neighborhood.

This project created three commercial condominium spaces for expanded arts programs through Kennedy Heights Arts Center as well as a Montessori school.

The new facility, which will also host community events, provides a visible reminder of the neighborhood's ongoing revitalization.
